



Our headline 2023 SATs results for Key Stage 2 were: -

- In writing 68% of Year 6 children achieved at least the national standard (Nationally 71%) with 11% reaching the higher standard.

- In reading 45% of Year 6 children achieved at least the national standard (Nationally 73%) with 13% reaching the higher standard.

Average scaled score: 100.9

- In maths 61% of Year 6 children achieved at least the national standard (Nationally 73%) with 14% reaching the higher standard.

Average scaled score: 102.2

- In grammar, punctuation and spelling 68% of Year 6 children achieved at least the national standard (Nationally 72%) with 20% reaching the higher standard.

Average scaled score- 103.7

38% of Year 6 children achieved the national standard in reading, writing and maths combined. This compares to 60% nationally

Progress

The Department for Education calculates the progress that each child makes using a scale where 0 is the average rate of progress made nationally by all children. Positive figures demonstrate the cohort has made better than expected progress and negative figures demonstrate progress that is less than expected.

- The school's value-added score for reading is -5.28.

- The school's value-added score for writing is -1.20.

- The school's value-added score for maths is -2.97.
