Attendance

You will already know that good attendance gives your child every chance of success and helps develop skills for life.

However did you know that pupils who are persistently absent (90% attendance or lower) have been shown to have lower levels of attainment in the Year 6 SATs than any other pupils?

Of those who were persistently absent only 40% achieved the expected standard nationally in reading, writing and maths compared to 83.9% of pupils who missed no session and 71.9% who missed between 0 and 5% of sessions.
